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NNAT (Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test) is a non-verbal test that is used to qualify kindergarten through 12th grade students for gifted and talented programs. NNAT uses a non-verbal model to evaluate students because it uses shapes and shapes to assess a student's ability to solve problems. Like OLSAT, NNAT does not test a child on what he or she learned at school, but instead focuses on visual-spatial reasoning skills. NNAT has become a popular admission test in gifted and talented programs, as it is used in various school districts throughout the United States. The latest version of NNAT is NNAT3, which includes 48 questions that are broken down into four different types of questions. NNAT3, NNAT-2 and Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test (NNAT First Class Test) are an excellent test for children who are visually spatially oriented. This is because the test relies on shapes and numbers to test the ability of students to reasoning, as opposed to verbal tests, which tend to rely more on language. If your child is not shrewd with nonverbal issues, you need to really prepare them for the NNAT3 test as these skills come into play. Even if your child is strong in visual and spatial materials, it is important to prepare him for the test, as it is hard and can be competitive. Here are the preliminary questions: Each question deals with a different topic, and explanations follow. Before you try to resolve the issue, you should read the instructions. All of these questions are suitable for the B NNAT level test. Look at the design in a large rectangle, paying attention to the missing square. What choice of answer completes the design? Look for a link between the shapes between the rows and down the columns. The direction in which you are considering the issue should depend on where you can most easily similar to the relationship. Identify the image that completes the pattern by studying how the series series changes in rows and down columns in the matrix. Where you can most easily visualize a relationship will determine the direction in which you explore the issue. Answers to this question: A. Look at the arrow in the upper left corner of the large rectangle. When clockwise on the sides of the rectangle, each blue arrow rotates 90 degrees counterclockwise. Rotating the arrow to the right of the empty square 90 degrees counterclockwise will result in a vertical blue arrow pointing downwards. Please note that only part of the arrow is missing. The only answer that matches these properties is to choose the answer A. Another way to solve questions will be to use image symmetry. Imagine a horizontal line running through the middle of the image. It's easy to see that the top is a reverse image of the bottom. Now we can understand that the missing part in the picture will be a reverse image of what appears above it. Above the missing part, we see an arrow pointing upwards, so its reverse image will be the arrow pointing downwards. Thus, the only possible answer is to select an answer A. The left figure, which contains a blue square on a yellow background, is identical to the right figure. Look at the middle row. The left figure, which contains a white triangle on a blue background, is identical to the right figure. Now take a look at the bottom row. The numbers in the bottom row will stick to the same relationship. The left figure, a yellow circle on a white background, will be identical to the right figure. The correct answer is to choose the answer A. The correct answer C. Through rows and down columns, each line and column contains one hexagon, one diamond and one trapezoidal. Since the bottom row and the third column contain one diamond and a trapezoid, the empty square will contain a hexagon. We can exclude the answers options B and D. Notice the color scheme of the matrix. Each other frame contains an image with a different background color (yellow or white). Because the middle frame in the third column contains a white background, and the middle frame in the third row contains a white background, the answer will be for the image with a yellow background.
